

**Faculty of Kinesiology Research Travel Award**  
**Terms of Reference**

*This scholarship supports graduate students pursuing a national or international research experience and is intended to cover costs associated with travel and living expenses while away.*

- Donor:** Faculty of Kinesiology
- Field of Study:** Kinesiology
- Value:** Up to \$6,000
- Number:** Variable, based on availability of funding
- Duration:** One year
- Eligibility:** Open to students registered full-time in a graduate program in Kinesiology who are undertaking a research experience outside of the University of Calgary.
- The research period is to be a minimum of one month to a maximum of 6 months
  - The start of the research experience must be after the competition deadline date and be started before the next competition deadline date
  - Students must remain registered full-time at the University of Calgary and must return to complete their degree at the University of Calgary
  - Students who hold a Tri-council CGS and are eligible for the Michael Smith Foreign Study supplement are not eligible for this award
  - If possible, students are expected first to apply to the FGS International Research Excellence Award or other relevant sources of funding such as MITACS support awards
  - Students who have received funding from other sources for this experience are not eligible to hold the award (i.e. FGS International Research Excellence Award)
    - In cases where the funding received is below the Kinesiology Research Travel Award level a top up to this level may be provided.
- Citizenship:** Unrestricted
- Apply:** Complete applications include:
- Description of proposed research travel and how it relates to the student's dissertation or field of study
  - Travel budget
  - Short letter from supervisor outlining benefits of research and supporting the experience
    - Course-based students must provide a short letter from the MKin Director and/or Practicum Coordinator indicating the research focus of the practicum experience

Applications are evaluated and approved by the Office of the Associate Dean (Graduate)

**Deadline:** January 2 and July 2 each year
