

What is Kinesiology?

Kinesiology is the study of human movement and how it affects our health and well-being. It's a strong starting point for careers in sport, fitness, health care, recreation, and education.

Kinesiology Majors at UCalgary

Students can earn a Bachelor of Kinesiology or a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology. Both degrees allow you to choose a general major or specialize in a specific area. A general major gives you more flexibility to take option courses, explore minors or embedded certificates, and meet requirements for future programs. A specialized major focuses your studies more deeply in a particular area.

Bachelor of Kinesiology

Kinesiology: offers more flexibility in elective courses.

Leadership and Coaching: explores the foundations of leadership and physical literacy in a variety of sport, health, and community settings.

Motor and Psychosocial Aspects of Movement: focuses on the neural, cognitive, and psychosocial factors that influence human behaviour in physical activity, sport, and health.

Bachelor of Science

Kinesiology: emphasis on science-based courses with flexibility in electives. **Biomechanics**: examines the forces acting on and within biological structures and the effects produced by these forces.

Exercise and Health Physiology: explores how lifestyle, exercise, and nutrition impact human physiology, with a foundation in human movement and function. **Motor and Psychosocial Aspects of Movement**: focuses on the neural, cognitive, and psychosocial factors that influence human behaviour in physical activity, sport, and health, with greater emphasis on science-based courses.
